



Camp Policies

1. Each camping group will comply with all Camp Cascade regulations and schedules.
2. The camp representative (or other person) will confer with Camp Cascade Managers regarding any problems that arise. Any camping operational problems that arise should be reported immediately to the camp managers.
3. The camp director who has signed the "Lease Agreement and Regulations" is expected to have a copy of it signed and with he/she.
4. Fees must be paid to the manager at the close of each camp, or arrangements for payment must be made before the camp arrives.
5. Unless otherwise specified in this lease, arrival time is 4:00 pm and departure time is 2:00 pm. Any group arriving before their designated arrival time or departing after their designated departure time will be charged for one extra day at the set daily rate.
6. Before leaving the campground on the final day, the camp director must meet with the Camp Cascade Managers for a thorough check of the campground, including cabins, restrooms, lodge, dining hall and grounds. Any cleanup that still needs to be done must be done before the camping group can leave.
7. Camping Directors are required to guarantee their number of campers 14 days before arrival. Meal fees and number of meals prepared will be based upon actual campers present at camp.
8. Each camping director will have an adult designated as "dining hall supervisor", who will assist in the dining areas as supervised by the Head Cook.
9. Each camp director will be responsible for all damages incurred while occupying the camp (reasonable wear excepted). The camp director shall be responsible for excessive or malicious damage occurring during the rental period. A \$50.00 minimum fine will be assessed for graffiti on any camp property to cover labor and material expenses.
10. A deposit of \$200.00 will be paid to the Camp Cascade at the time this lease is submitted. This deposit will be applied to the camping fee upon certification by the Camp Cascade Manager that there has been no property damage. This deposit is non-refundable.
11. Camp Cascade will accept no responsibility for any personal injury or property damage to any occupant of the camp, and will not provide insurance protection for any person on the camp property. Camping groups must furnish a liability insurance certificate or policy in the amount of \$500,000 covering bodily injury and property damage, and naming Camp Cascade as additional insured. Camp Cascade will accept no responsibility for knowing medical considerations of individual campers. If campers do have medical considerations the managers should be aware of, it is the responsibility of the group's director to inform them of such.
12. A "permission liability release statement" form (copy furnished with this lease) must be signed by guardians of all minors in attendance at the camp, and these forms must be presented to the camp manager upon arrival.
13. All watercraft usage must adhere to posted regulations.
14. Leave equipment, beds and other items in place unless you have specific permission from the Camp Cascade Managers to move them.
15. Vehicles on the campground can be used for loading and unloading only, then parked in designated areas and are not to be used for transportation on the campground.
16. Motorcycles and ATVs are to be used to drive only onto and off of the campground.

17. Prohibited activities:

- a. No alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs on the camp property.
- b. No smoking is allowed inside of any buildings. SMOKING IN DESIGNATED AREAS ONLY.
- c. No fireworks, firearms, ammunition or other explosive and/or projectile firing devices.
- d. No cutting, picking, mutilating, removing or defacing live trees, shrubs or other plants. (Plants may be collected with permission of the Camp Manager for instructional purposes only.)
- e. No vehicles of any kind or tents are allowed to be on the Bureau of Reclamation land to the east and south. There are boundaries and it is the responsibility of the renting party to find and honor these.

18. Fire Prevention

- a. Building campfires in designated areas only.
- b. Completely extinguish any campfire with water before retiring or leaving area.
- c. Do not use candles in cabins or other buildings on grounds.

19. Use only designated toilet facilities.

20. Pets are discouraged at the camp. Since pets are not allowed in buildings, you must be in a RV space. Your pet must be under control and not bother other campers. Feces must be picked up. Your pet needs to be on a leash or in a kennel at all times.

NOISE LEVEL GUIDELINES: No live bands after 10:00 pm. No megaphones outside. No amplified noise after 10:00 pm. Campers need to be in the lodge, cabins or at campfires after 10:00 pm. Noise levels need to be reduced with no screaming after 10:00 pm. Campers need to be in their cabins by 11:30 pm with lights out at 12:00 am and QUIET. No leaving the cabins after 12:00 am. Campers need to supervised, so that no camper leaves the campus after dark.
